Dear Don,
Nice to see you yesterday! James Norton invited me to come precisely to urge me to talk to as many key people as possible about this Quarry Project. Knowing that you are the very key, but knowing that this is supposed to be a relaxing time for you, I was trying not to turn your evening into a "business" one. However, I wish I have talked to you more, not about "Business", but about Life in general. But in this case, it's hard to distinguish these two!

After talking to Walter about presenting the case to the Board of Selectmen, I have been talking to surveyors and my engineer Desheng about preparing a plan that could show concrete data of the land I am proposing to swap (since this is the biggest item in this proposal). At this point, I feel it is premature to have a complete survey done to the property (because it will cost more than \$6,000 and take more than a month period of time). However, looking at the drawing that Tom showed at our last meeting which has the tennis court drawn on the map, it's pretty safe to propose an area that is sufficient to have a septic system put in. I will work with the engineer and Tom again to define this area. Meanwhile, can I plead for your help to move things along by talking to Tom about this and recommend my proposal to go in front of the Board of Selectmen in this coming Board meeting?
