I spoke with Glen Kaufman this morning and he is going to install a temporary berm/check dam on Colonial Path by the close of construction today. This will be in preparation for the potential storm this weekend. I told him that I want to try and divert any runoff from Colonial Path into the detention basin before it discharges onto Sylvia Street. Glen said the the catch basins on Colonial Path collect a lot of runoff now but that he will install some sort of temporary berm so that any runoff that might bypass these CBs will be diverted into the detention basin.
