The pilot program was initially instituted for three months and subsequently extended by the Selectmen until July 1, 2007. The Engineering Department has been administering the program and the Police Department has been enforcing the rules.

Presently 22 spaces are rented. A maximum of 28 spaces have been rented in the past. Previous users have said they intend to rent a space again in the fall when spaces in the main commuter lot are not available after the 7:18 train. To keep the administrative costs to a minimum, the spaces are rented for a minimum of 3 months. The Highway Department has requested that one of the spaces not be rented due to difficulty in plowing. The Police Department has been monitoring the area and reports no increase in commuters parking on neighborhood streets. The Recreation Department has not received any complaints regarding parking from the various users of Jones Field.
