

REFUNDS & WITHDRAWALS POLICY: You may withdraw from a program up to 7 (seven) business days prior to the start date--an administrative fee of \$10 will be applied to all registrations. After that time, no refunds will be issued. All refunds must be submitted in writing to the Recreation Department requesting withdrawal and refund. It will take two-three weeks for the refund to be processed. Refunds will not be made for classes missed due to inclement weather. Exception to policy: a written letter from a licensed physician excusing participant from a program. The Recreation Department reserves the right to suspend a participant in a program due to inappropriate behavior. No refunds will be given for any participant who has been suspended from a program. NOTE: Certain programs and trips have separate refund policies and will be duly noted in description and/or on form.

CLASS CANCELLATION POLICY: Classes are cancelled if Acton Boxborough Schools have closed or have early dismissal due to weather. Notification via email for Recreation Dept. run programs will be made if a class is cancelled due to poor weather or field conditions. Programs run outside of the Recreation Department are responsible to notify participants of class cancellations. Efforts will be made to make-up weather cancelled classes, but are not guaranteed. Any class cancellations due to an illness of an instructor will be made-up or refunded. Refunds will not be offered due to a participant's inability to partake in missed make-up sessions.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Registration begins for classes once published on the Recreation Dept. page of the Town website: www.acton-ma.gov and/or in print. You can register in person at the Recreation Department located at the Acton Town Hall, 472 Main Street, Acton, MA 01720 or by mailing in your registration form and payment. **There are no additional fees assessed for out-of-town residents.** You are welcome to register any time for a program provided it is not past a posted registration deadline. All programs are on a **first come, first served basis.**

PAYMENT: We accept cash, money orders, checks, and MasterCard or VISA (\$3 fee per \$100 transaction credit card transaction). Class fee pro-ration is at the discretion of the Recreation Department. Checks and money orders are made payable to: **Town of Acton** **NOTE:** *No out of state checks will be accepted.* One check can pay for multiple programs. Returned Check Fee: \$20 Credit card sales must be done in person at Town Hall.

WAYS TO REGISTER: Walk-in Registration is accepted as long as space is available with payment of cash, check or credit card. Mail-in registrations are processed after walk-ins and payment by check or money order. Payment MUST be received with the registration form to be processed.

PROXY REGISTRATIONS, PROGRAM CONFIRMATION & DISCLAIMER: A person may submit another's registration form, provided the form is properly completed and signed. Limit is ONE PER PERSON. The Recreation Department reserves the right to correct mistakes or adjust program fees made in this brochure at the time of release by print or internet and cancel any program due to low enrollment or poor weather. **Confirmations are not mailed out. All registrations are considered accepted unless you are contacted – no news is good news.**

FINANCIAL AID: Financial Aid is available for Acton residents based on financial need through the Doli Atamian Campership Program. You may contact them at 978-263-0131 or write a letter of request to Doli Atamian Campership Program, Inc., PO Box 693, Acton, MA 01720

PHOTO POLICY: Acton Recreation Department and events are often photographed for promotional purposes. If you do not wish to be included in Recreation photos, please indicate this to the photographer.

HOURS: The Town Hall is closed on Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving and day after Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Years Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents Day, Patriots Day, Memorial Day and July 4. Classes are not run on these dates. Town Hall business hours are Monday-Friday 8AM-5PM. The Recreation Department has a door slot for form drop-offs during hours when the Recreation Department is closed or unavailable. After hours, forms (in envelope addressed to "Recreation Dept.") may be dropped in the message drop located outside the Town Hall lower parking lot entry doorway.

REFUNDS & WITHDRAWALS: You may withdraw from a program up to 7 (seven) business days prior to the start date—a non-refundable administrative fee of **\$10 will be applied to all registrations.** After that time, no refunds will be issued. All refunds must be submitted in writing to the Recreation Department requesting withdrawal and refund. It will take two-three weeks for the refund to be processed. Refunds will not be made for classes missed due to inclement weather. Exception to policy: a written letter from a licensed physician excusing participant from a program. Some programs including *NARA Beach, NARA Youth Summer programs, show tickets, bus trips and theatre group* have separate refund policies and will be duly noted in description and/or on form. Please inquire prior to any registration if you have any refund questions.

Veteran's Field: Veteran's Field is located at the intersection of 2A and Route 27. This Field consists of 2 Little League diamonds and a playground. This is a tournament quality lighted field.

Concord Rd. Field: Concord Rd. Field is located off of Concord Rd. between Ice House Pond and the cemetery entrance. It is a multi-use soccer field.

Elm St. Fields: The Elm St. playing fields are located on Elm Street next to the Douglas School (25 Elm Street) in West Acton. The Elm St. fields consist of a playground and picnic area, two tennis courts and, a lighted softball diamond, practice area and small soccer field.

Gardner Field: Gardner Field is located off of Rte. 111 (Mass. Ave.) near Kinsley Rd. This field consists of a playground, basketball hoop, and field area.

Goward Playground: Goward Playground is located behind the Acton Memorial Library in Acton Center.

Great Hill: Great Hill is located off of School St. behind the South Acton Fire station. This field contains a soccer field located adjacent to the Great Hill Conservation Area.

Hart Field: Hart Field is located at the Conant Elementary School. This field consists of a baseball/softball diamond.

Jones Field: Jones Field is located off of Martin St. This field consists of a playground and a full size baseball diamond.

MacPherson Field: MacPherson Field is located at the Conant Elementary School. This field consists of a baseball diamond.

School St. Field: The School St. fields are located at the end of School St. off of Rte. 2 East. This field consists of soccer fields.

Community Gardens: Located off Rt. 27 in N. Acton. Garden sign-ups begin on/around Dec. 15. There are approximately 45 garden plots varying from ½ to full plots. Morrison Farm Community Gardens are located on Concord Road and have 24 garden plots.

Ice House Pond: The Ice House Pond is located off of Concord Rd. This pond has fishing and a picnic area.

Morrison Property: Take Rt. 2A west at the Concord Rotary, follow Rt. 2A into Acton, turn left onto Concord Road Farm is on right, after Ice House Pond.

Little Great Hill: Little Great Hill is located off of School St. behind the South Acton Fire station and to the left of the Great Hill Field. This field contains small sized soccer fields.

NARA Park: NARA Park was opened in the summer of 1999. It is located at 25 Ledge Rock Way off of Rte. 27 (Main St.). NARA Park is home to the NARA Youth and Mighty Mini Summer Programs and also our summer cultural concert series. The park consists of a playground, NARA Pond and beach, a walking trail (approx. one mile loop), a softball field, a picnic pavilion, 3 soccer fields and an amphitheater.

T.J. O'Grady Skate Park: This facility is for skateboarding and rollerblading and was opened in the fall of 2005. The park is free and is open to the general public during daylight hours. The Skate Park is located on Hayward Road (near the ABRHS).


NARA PARK

Directions to get to NARA Park:

From 495N - Take Exit 29A (to Rte 2 East). Take Exit 42 (Rte 27 Acton, Maynard). Take left at end of the ramp. Follow Rte 27. Go straight through 2 sets of lights. Approximately 9/10th's of a mile from the second set of lights Quarry Road will be located on your left. Go to the end of Quarry Road and when you see the last house on the left, take your next right into the parking lot. If you end up on a dirt road, you've gone too far. Amphitheater will be located to the right.

From Rte 128 - Take Exit 29 (Rte 2 West). Take Exit 41 (Rte 27 Acton, Maynard). Take right at the end of ramp. Follow Rte 27. Go straight through 2 sets of lights. Approximately 9/10th's of a mile from the second set of lights Quarry Road will be located on your left. Go to the end of Quarry Road and when you see the last house on the left, take your next right into the parking lot. If you end up on a dirt road, you've gone too far. Amphitheater will be located to the right.

All requests are subject to a two-week processing period once received and are not issued until confirmation and payment is received. We are unable to give information on rental availability or pricing until a Facilities Request Form has been completed and submitted for review.

Recreation Classes & Programs

1. PLAYGROUND PLAYGROUP

Join us weekly at the NARA Park playground, meet new friends and socialize with other toddlers. This non-instructional class is designed to be a social group for children **ages 18 mos. to 4 years** of age. We will provide an array of age-appropriate equipment for your child to experiment with. Please bring a snack and drink for your child.

2. PARENT AND TOT FALL HIKING SESSIONS

Join in on the fun with other parents and small children hiking the conservation areas in Acton. This class is geared for **parents and young children** to experience the joint venture of nature and new friends. **Parents and their children from newborns and up**, can join in this great hiking session. Small infants can be brought in snugly packs or in an infant back carrier. This hike will be adaptable for young children. We will be stopping for a parent provided snack during our hike.

3. START SMART SPORTS DEVELOPMENT

Start Smart teaches children **ages 3-5** the basic motor skills necessary to play organized sports, while they work one-on-one and spend quality time with their parents. The program focuses on teaching children and their parents basic sport mechanics without the threat of competition or the fear of getting hurt. Each class will focus on an exercise which will become increasingly more challenging as the class progresses and the children show improvement. This class focuses on the skills of catching, throwing, kicking and hitting.

Start Smart Baseball was developed to assist young children **3-5 years old** in learning the basic skills necessary for a successful first time experience in organized baseball or tee ball. Start Smart Baseball is an offshoot of the popular Start Smart Sports Development Program. Start Smart Baseball focuses on including parents as an integral part of their child's learning process. Parents participate one-on-one with their child with the guidance of an instructor teaching them the baseball skills of throwing, catching, batting, and running/agility.

Our most popular Start Smart program! Parents participate one-on-one with their child with the guidance of an instructor teaching them the soccer skills of kicking, dribbling, trapping, throw-ins and agility.

18. DALCROZE EURHYTHMICS

This class is offered in various sessions for **ages infant to age 6**. The goal of our Dalcroze curriculum is to develop a lifelong love and understanding of music and to make it an integral part of the child's life. In Dalcroze Eurhythmics, the joy of moving the body fosters the learning of musical concepts such as beat, dynamics, durations, melodic direction, meter, form, and phrasing. Listening games and activities are designed to allow the students to "find" a concept in the music, for example, high/low pitches, faster/slower rhythm patterns, loud/soft tones. Through movement activities, such as walking, running and galloping, children: experience beat, meter, and rhythm. As the year proceeds, children are able to describe their rhythmic movement, and, at older levels, are able to identify note values as well as effortlessly read and notate simple rhythms. Specific ear training games allow the students to develop their inner hearing as well as their singing voices. When singing, they use their hands and arms to show the shape of the melody or phrase. Just as the walking and running movements help children feel and internalize rhythm, arm movements help children feel and internalize the relationships of pitches while tuning the voice and ear to each other.
