

On November 20 and 21, 2003 I conducted a survey at the Acton Commuter Lot as you requested and the following were the results.


November 20, 2003.

A survey of the 141 resident parking spots was performed to check on the validity of the resident parking decal that are displayed on the vehicle. Five (5) vehicles were found to have resident decals on the vehicle and the vehicles were not registered to Acton residents, (see attached photos and RMV listings. On this day there were (8) vehicles parked at the meters that displayed a current resident parking decal.

November 21, 2003.

I checked all of the 121 metered spots on this day and found that (9) vehicles were parked at the meters that displayed a current resident parking decal. I also found that (6) vehicles were parked at meters that were Acton residents but did not have a commuter lot parking decal.
