


REFUNDS & WITHDRAWALS POLICY: You may withdraw from a program up to 7 (seven) business days prior to the start date—a non-refundable administrative fee of \$10 will be applied to all registrations. After that time, no refunds will be issued. All refunds must be submitted in writing to the Recreation Department requesting withdrawal and refund. It will take two-three weeks for the refund to be processed. Refunds will not be made for classes missed due to inclement weather. Exception to policy: a written letter from a licensed physician excusing participant if received prior to start of a program. The Recreation Department reserves the right to suspend a participant in a program due to inappropriate behavior. No refunds will be given for any participant who has been suspended from a program. **NOTE: Certain programs and trips have separate refund policies and will be duly noted in description and/or on form.**

CLASS CANCELLATION POLICY: Classes are cancelled if Acton-Boxborough Schools have closed or have early dismissal due to weather. Notification via email for Recreation Dept. run programs will be made if a class is cancelled due to poor weather or field conditions or lack of minimum participants. Programs run outside of the Recreation Department are responsible to notify participants of class cancellations. Efforts will be made to makeup weather cancelled classes, but are not guaranteed. Any class cancellations due to an illness of an instructor will be made-up or refunded. Refunds will not be offered due to a participant's inability to partake in makeup session(s). Some programs or classes have special cancellation policies and are noted in program description and/or special registration form. **Show Tickets:** 100% non-refundable, but are transferable.

GENERAL INFORMATION

BUS TRIPS: Bus trips will run if minimum amount of registrations are received. Many of our trips are merged with other local town departments to fill a bus to help meet the minimum required. If trip is cancelled due to the lack of minimum participants, a full refund will be issued. Please note that pickup/drop-off locations are subject to change if adequate number of registrations are not received for a pickup location in Acton. Refunds will not be issued for a non-Acton pickup/drop-off location. In the event of illness, a trip can be transferred but not refunded once commitment has been made. If you have any refund questions, please inquire prior to signing up. All changes and special requests must be completed in writing up to 30 days prior to the trip and are subject to a cancellation fee per person, noted on each bus trip description. No refunds will be issued with less than 30 days notice.

CLASS CANCELLATION POLICY: Classes are cancelled if Acton-Boxborough Schools have closed due to weather. Notification via email for Recreation Dept. run programs will be made if a class is cancelled due to poor weather or field conditions. Every attempt will be made to inform participants of program cancellation due to inclement weather. Programs run by instructors outside of the Recreation Department are responsible to notify participants of class cancellations. Efforts will be made to makeup weather cancelled classes, but are not guaranteed. Any class cancellations due to an illness of an instructor will be made-up or refunded. Refunds will not be offered due to a participant's inability to partake in makeup sessions.


HOURS: The Town Hall is closed on Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving and day after Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Years Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents Day, Patriots Day, Memorial Day and July 4. Acton Recreation Dept. run classes/programs are not run on these dates. Town Hall business hours are Monday-Friday 8AM-5PM. The Recreation Department has a door slot for registration drop-off during Town Hall hours when the Recreation Department staff is unavailable. After hours, forms (in envelope addressed to "Recreation Dept.") may be dropped in the message drop located outside the Town Hall lower parking lot entryway.

PAYMENT: Payment is due at the time of registration. You may pay by cash, check, money order, MasterCard or Visa. All Credit card transactions must be processed in person at Recreation Department by cardholder. Class Fee pro-ration is at the discretion of the Recreation Department only. **Checks and money orders are made payable to: Town of Acton** NOTE: Out of state checks will not be accepted. One check can pay for multiple programs. All returned checks will be assessed a fee of \$25.

PHOTO POLICY: Acton Recreation Department events are often photographed for promotional purposes. If you do not wish to be included in Recreation photos, please indicate this to the photographer.

PROXY REGISTRATIONS, PROGRAM CONFIRMATION & DISCLAIMER: A person may submit another's registration form, provided the form is properly completed and signed. Limit is one per person. The Recreation Department reserves the right to correct mistakes or adjust program fees made in this brochure at the time of release by print or internet and reserves the right to cancel any program due to low enrollment or poor weather. **Confirmations are not mailed out. All registrations are considered accepted unless you are contacted – no news is good news.**

REFUNDS & WITHDRAWALS: Refunds are given if programs are canceled or if registration fails because the activity is full. You may withdraw from a program up to 7 (seven) business days prior to the start date—a non-refundable administrative fee of **\$10 will be applied to all registrations.** After that time, no refunds will be issued. All requests must be submitted in writing to the Recreation Department (withdrawals through instructor are not accepted) requesting withdrawal and refund request. It will take two-three weeks for a refund to be processed. *Refunds will not be made for classes missed due to inclement weather or a participant's inability to attend a makeup session or inability to participate due to medical condition after a program has started.* Exception to policy: a written letter excusing participate from a licensed physician prior to start of a program. Some programs including NARA Beach, NARA Summer Camp, show tickets, and bus trips have different refund policies and will be duly noted in description and /or on form. **Please inquire prior to any registration if you have any refund questions.**



REGISTRATION begins for classes once published on the Recreation Dept. page of the Town website: www.acton-ma.gov and/or in print. You can **register in person** at the Recreation Department located at the Acton Town Hall, 472 Main Street, Acton, MA 01720 or **by mailing** in your registration form with payment. Incomplete registration forms will not be processed. At this time, we do not offer phone or online registration.

There are no additional Fees assessed for out-of-town residents. You are welcome to register any time for a program provided it is not past a posted registration deadline. All programs are on a **first come, first served** basis.

Community Gardens: North Acton Community Gardens are located off Rt. 27 in N. Acton. Morrison Farm Community Gardens are located on Concord Road. New plots open beginning the second Friday of December annually for both locations. Registration is in person on a first-come basis. Plots vary from ½ to full plots for both Acton and non-Acton Residents.

Concord Rd. Field: (104 Concord Rd.) Concord Rd. Field is located off of Concord Rd. between Ice House Pond and the cemetery entrance. It is a multi-use soccer field.

Elm St. Fields: (21 Elm Street) The Elm St. playing fields are located on Elm Street next to the Douglas School (25 Elm Street) in West Acton. The Elm St. fields consist of a playground and picnic area, two tennis courts and, a lighted softball diamond, practice area and small soccer field.

Gardner Field: Gardner Field is located off of Rte. 111 (Mass. Ave.) near Kinsley Rd. This field consists of a playground, basketball hoop, and field area.

Goward Playground: (486 Main St.)Goward Playground is located behind the Acton Memorial Library in Acton Center.

Great Hill: (54 School Street) Great Hill is located off of School St. behind the South Acton Fire station. This field contains a soccer field located adjacent to the Great Hill Conservation Area.

Hart Field: (80 Taylor Rd.) Hart Field is located at the Conant Elementary School. This field consists of a baseball/softball diamond.

Ice House Pond: The Ice House Pond is located off of Concord Rd. This pond has fishing and a picnic area.

Jones Field: Jones Field is located off of Martin St. This field consists of a playground and a full size baseball diamond.

Little Great Hill: (54 School St.) Little Great Hill is located off of School St. behind the South Acton Fire station and to the left of the Great Hill Field. This field contains small sized soccer fields.

MacPherson Field: (80 Taylor Rd.) MacPherson Field is located at the Conant Elementary School. This field consists of a baseball diamond.

Morrison Property: (116 Concord Rd.) Take Rt. 2A west at the Concord Rotary, follow Rt. 2A into Acton, turn left onto Concord Road Farm is on right, after Ice House Pond.

NARA Park: (25 Ledge Rock Way) NARA Park was opened in the summer of 1999. It is located at 25 Ledge Rock Way off of Rte. 27 (Main St.). NARA Park is home to the NARA Youth and Mighty Mini Summer Programs and also our summer cultural concert series. The park consists of a playground, NARA Pond and beach, a walking trail (approx. one mile loop), a softball field, a picnic pavilion, 3 soccer fields and an amphitheater.

School St. Field: (343-347 School Street) The School St. fields are located at the end of School St. off of Rte. 2 East. This field consists of soccer fields.

T.J. O'Grady Skate Park: (66 Hayward Rd.) This facility is for skateboarding and rollerblading and was opened in the fall of 2005. The park is free and is open to the general public during daylight hours. The Skate Park is located on Hayward Road (near the ABRHS)

Veteran's Field: (655 Main St.) Veteran's Field is located at the intersection of 2A and Route 27. This Field consists of 2 Little League diamonds and a playground. This is a tournament quality lighted field.



Directions to NARA Park:

From 495N - Take Exit 29A (to Rte 2 East). Take Exit 42 (Rte 27 Acton, Maynard). Take left at end of the ramp. Follow Rte 27. Go straight through 2 sets of lights. Approximately 9/10th's of a mile from the second set of lights Quarry Road will be located on your left. Go to the end of Quarry Road and when you see the last house on the left, take your next right into the parking lot. If you reach a dirt road, you've gone too far. Amphitheater will be located to the right.

From Rte 128 - Take Exit 29 (Rte 2 West). Take Exit 41 (Rte 27 Acton, Maynard). Take right at the end of ramp. Follow Rte 27. Go straight through 2 sets of lights. Approximately 9/10th's of a mile from the second set of lights Quarry Road will be located on your left. Go to the end of Quarry Road and when you see the last house on the left, take your next right into the parking lot. If you reach a dirt road, you've gone too far. Amphitheater will be located to the right.

WELCOME TO A LITTLE BIT OF PARADISE IN THE HEART OF ACTON CENTER

The Acton Arboretum is situated on 64 acres of town conservation land amidst gardens, former apple orchards, meadows, woods, and wetlands in the heart of Town Center, Acton, Massachusetts. The beauty of the butterfly garden, shown here at the height of summer, draws butterflies and visitors alike and is only one of several gardens near the Arboretum's main Taylor Road entrance that both inform and delight.

Our daylily, hosta, herb, wildflower, and rhododendron gardens are equally spectacular and dot the more developed landscape of the Upper Grounds among a fine collection of specimen trees and shrubs. From the main entrance of the Arboretum and parking area off Taylor Road at Main Street (Route 27), a well-groomed universal access trail through the more developed Upper Grounds of the Arboretum leads visitors first along a swale that borders the lawn area. The swale's banks are lushly planted with roses, irises, and fragrant shrubs. A picturesque footbridge spanning the swale leads to our daylily and hosta gardens. The universal trail continues along the butterfly garden pictured above and to the herb garden planted with herbs that were commonly used in colonial times. In the spring, visitors can also enjoy the delicate beauty of the wildflower and rhododendron gardens.

To inform our visitors, specimen trees and shrubs and many plant varieties suitable for the home garden are clearly labeled with common and botanical names through a gift from the Friends of the Acton Arboretum. The Friends have also given generously to the Town for the construction of the universal access trail. A fragrance and sensory garden is a special destination still being developed along a new section of the universal access trail constructed in summer of 2007.

New trail construction was funded by a grant from the Community Preservation Commission. Other donations to this project include benches from the Friends of the Acton Arboretum and a fragrant summer-blooming azalea collection and other fragrant trees and shrubs from Weston Nurseries.

This class is offered in various sessions for ages 5 months to 6 years. The goal of our Dalcroze curriculum is to develop a lifelong love and understanding of music and to make it an integral part of the child's life. In Dalcroze Eurhythmics, the joy of moving the body fosters the learning of musical concepts such as beat, dynamics, durations, melodic direction, meter, form, and phrasing. Listening games and activities are designed to allow the students to "find" a concept in the music, for example, high/low pitches, faster/slower rhythm patterns, loud/soft tones. Through movement activities, such as walking, running and galloping, children: experience beat, meter, and rhythm. As the year proceeds, children are able to describe their rhythmic movement, and, at older levels, are able to identify note values as well as effortlessly read and notate simple rhythms. Specific ear training games allow the students to develop their inner hearing as well as their singing voices. When singing, they use their hands and arms to show the shape of the melody or phrase. Just as the walking and running movements help children feel and internalize rhythm, arm movements help children feel and internalize the relationships of pitches while tuning the voice and ear to each other. 


