

Land Stewardship Committee Meeting Minutes  
May 18, 2011  
Acton Town Hall

Meeting Minutes: The April minutes were accepted and approved.

Poster Holder: Philip brought in a sample poster holder. It is about 11"x17" and is made of plywood that is sealed. It could be good for holding the 'You Are Here' maps at Spring Hill. Peggy and Bettina will put it up at Great Hill in order to test it for future use.

Guidebooks: We are running low on Guidebooks. EMS sells a lot of them and needs more. Nan will give them some. Tom A. said that postcard sized mailed or emailed information might replace the guidebook.

Summer Events: Jim suggested that there be a party that would include volunteers. It was decided to hold a potluck dinner party on Saturday, June 25, at 6 pm. The Committee voted to cancel the August meeting.

Scout Land: Jim has had some conversations with Bill Klauer regarding the scout land that is enveloped by conservation land. The scouts might like to sell the land to the Town.

Elm Trees: Bruce Carley has planted some elm trees around the Town. Two of his trees are in the Grassy Pond meadow. The larger of the two is a Liberty elm, a variety with an uncertain level of Dutch elm disease tolerance. The trunk of that tree is damaged. He expressed thanks for the removal of a fallen limb from that tree. The other elm is a Valley Forge. It has proven resistance to Dutch elm disease and reliable structural soundness when pruned correctly. Bruce welcomes correspondence from the Committee regarding the trees. His website is [www.elmpost.org/proves.htm](http://www.elmpost.org/proves.htm). Philip suggested we email Bruce and thank him for his work with the elm trees.

Camp Acton: The gate at Camp Acton is closed but not locked. Bob thought the gate should be locked. Possibly campers could portage their belongings in by using a cart. It would be good to enlarge the parking area close to Pope Road. However, this is difficult to do because of the wetlands, according to Tom Tidman. Tom will mull over possible solutions. Bruce said that it would be good if the logs in the amphitheater were removed. Bruce will get the scouts to stencil all the picnic tables with the number of the camp site where they belong. The other items for consideration at Camp Acton are firewood holders

Kiosks/Posters: Bob, Laurie, and Jim fixed the kiosk at Davis Road. Laurie will replace the posters after he has repainted the surface of the kiosk. Committee members can go to the LSCom link to print out posters to replace faded ones. Once printed the posters can be laminated at the Recreation Dept.

Some illegal posters advertising dog grooming have been put up on the kiosk boards. When seen such posters should be taken down. Jim called the people doing this and told them the rules and fees for such encroachment.

Parcel News: The steward of the Pacy land needs a map. Bob will send Tom the map making equipment so that a map may be made.

Joan mentioned that in autumn 2009 at Wetherbee, she reported that the sign (on Wetherbee St.) had been damaged and recommended that it be repaired. At the time, others felt it would be better to replace the entire sign in 2010 rather than repair the damage. However, that did not happen. At this meeting, Bob said it may only need one new board, and that he will investigate.

Parcel Visits: Jim has not seen some of the stewards in a while. In the fall he wants to meet with individual stewards and walk their property and check the boundaries. It might be good to invite some selectmen to go on these walks.

Jenks Bench: Tom A. found a good spot for a bench at Jenks. It is on a rocky knoll on the blue trail. The majority of the Committee members present were in favor of a bench made of recycled material that could be purchased at Conversion Products in Portland, ME. Also most favored that a plaque be placed on the front side of the bench, if desired. Joan will write a bench policy. Joan suggested that the bench price be stated plus suggesting that a voluntary donation be added to that price. Tom A. will take the recommendation for a bench at Jenks to the Conservation Commission in order to get their approval. Jim will take the people interested in donating a bench to the probable site for it. The Committee did have a formal vote for approving that one memorial bench be allowed at Jenks, that the bench be of recycled composite material at no cost to the Town. All but one were in favor.

Rules: Bob suggested that rule enforcement procedures be put on the agenda for a future meeting. Possibly a police officer could be present.

Knotweed: Bettina said that there is knotweed that needs knocking down at the Canoe Launch area.

Mosquito Fish: Mosquito fish are not native to this area and should not be put in ponds and streams as they might eat other amphibians and cause other damage.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:45. The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 15 at 4 pm.
