



DRAFT CRITERIA FOR PRIORITIZATION IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGIES

The number one criterion was giving highest priority to actions that reflect the preferred alternative from June 23rd public workshop and those actions that we felt best fulfill the vision, goals and objectives.

Other criteria include:

- Actions that seem to enjoy public support
- Actions that are the first step (e.g. develop a plan) for longer processes
- Actions that support on-going efforts to fulfill defined needs
- In some cases we gave a higher priority to actions that are “low hanging fruit” (low cost/high yield) and could be easily accomplished even though it may not be on par in importance with the highest priority items

NOTE:

1. Not all number one priority recommendations will make the list of “TOP____ KEY RECOMMENDATIONS
2. An effort was made to choose at least **three (3)** top priority strategies from each goal.
