RECORD OF VOTE OF THE ACTON BOARD OF SELECTMEN
February 23, 2015

At a duly called public meeting of the Acton Board of Selectmen on February 23, 2015 the Board voted as follows:

That the Board has determined that advertising under General Laws Chapter 30B for the Town's acquisition of the following parcels of real property will not benefit the governmental body's interest due to the unique qualities of the property:

Land consisting of approximately 6.5 acres identified as Parcels 1 and 5 on the Acton Assessor's Map H1, and constituting a portion of the property described in that certain deed dated December 15, 1999 and recorded with the Middlesex South District Registry of Deeds in Book 30999, Page 454 (the "Property").

Specifically, the Property abuts the Town of Acton Heath Hen Meadow conservation land and land being purchased by the Town of Stow. Acquiring the Property will create a key link between the 100 acre Heath Hen Meadow conservation land in South Acton and the 154 Captain Sargent conservation land in Stow. Hiking and cross country skiing opportunities will be significantly expanded for residents of Acton and the Property will also enable a large protected corridor for wildlife. Additionally, the preservation of the Property will offer water quality protection to downstream water supply resources.
