I am reaching out on behalf of the Wounded Warrior Project to schedule our 5th Annual Soldier Ride event taking place Saturday, September 26, 2015. I spoke with Chris Prehl at the Acton Police Department this morning as I could

not find a special event permit on the town's website. He suggested that I reach out to the Town Manager's Office for the permit.

Soldier Ride is a Wounded Warrior Project initiative that provides adaptive cycling opportunities across the country to help injured service members restore their physical and emotional well-being.

This email will provide you with some additional information, so you have a clear idea and expectation of the ride. I am looking forward to working with you on this event!

Attached to this email is a copy of the route and cue sheet for your reference.

Date: Saturday, September 26, 2015

Time: 8:00 am - 12:00 pm (approximate time)

Number of Participants 65 cyclists (50 wounded warriors + staff)

The event will begin and end at The Old Manse (269 Monument St, Concord, MA 01742).

With every Soldier Ride event we like to request a rolling police escort as well as EMS assistance to ensure the safety of our warriors. A Wounded Warrior Project (WWP) Van will lead the bikes followed by a SAG U-Haul carrying supplies.

We like to have the escort look something like this:

Lead cop car (vehicle 1) – WWP Van (vehicle 2) – Bikes – U-Haul (vehicle 3) – EMS (vehicle 4)
