Subject: Concord Municipal Light & Power Petition – Knox Trail

We have reviewed the petition from Concord Municipal Light & Power to install and maintain approximately 2000 feet of concrete-encased electric and telecommunication duct bank, including 3 manholes for cable splicing, along Knox Trail from the Town Line between the Town of Concord and the Town of Acton, to, on and through the property known as 37 Knox Trail.

Concord ML&P has shown that the proposed work will take place within the public right-of-way of the road. If any work occurs on private property, Concord ML&P will need to obtain an easement agreement with the homeowners.

Concord ML&P will be required to begin the work after the start of the construction season on March 15th. We recommend Concord ML&P locate the work within the shoulder of Knox Drive to avoid cutting the road. Knox trail was recently paved in 2012.

In order to maintain the utility in the future, Concord ML&P will be required to obtain and permit from our department and be subject to the Acton Specifications for Regulating Construction Within Public Ways. It is recommended that Concord ML&P coordinate any future maintenance plans for the utility with our office.

We don't foresee an issue in approving this request. Please let us know if you have any questions or comments regarding this matter.


