As I mentioned when you were here, I thought they had gone into the rag bucket. But since having learned the one drop rule it leads me to believe I was inturn putting the into the ink drum or I would have heard it from the rag supplier. The rags only get swapped out probably once a year at most, so it is hard to remember. I assume they go into the ink drum ... definitely not into the trash.

Good morning John,,

Please review the steps in our process listed below from your requests.

- * Towels are soil separated by color into large nylon slings
 - Orange towels are for machine shop and repair garage applications
 - Purple towels are for printing applications
 - White towels are for food service, furniture mfg, and others
- * Large nylon slings are then weighed and hung on our rail system that travels down to our washroom.
- * Towels are washed by color in 900# washer extractors. This wash process will run for 1.5 hrs to 2 hours.
- * The drain water from the bottom of the washers is diverted into our trench system for pre-treatment to our POTW
- * Once the towels have gone through the washing process they are then dried and folded for delivery to our customers

Waste water process

- * Waste water is then sent to our water treatment department for removal of oil and greases.
- * Water is then batch treated with coagulants and flocculent to lift the oil and grease

out of the water.

* This oil and grease sludge material is then skimmed from the top of the water and stored in a

tank for removal by our licensed vendor.

* This waste product is then blended with other waste oils for a secondary fuel source.

* Any leftover solids are then used in the cement or asphalt process
