Subject: Proposal to extend term of OLAC

With the vote by the Town to pass the new Outdoor Lighting bylaw, the original task of the temporary Outdoor Lighting Advisory Committee is concluded. However, we believe that for the near future there needs to be additional educational outreach to residents and businesses about general good outdoor lighting practices. In particular, we should develop educational materials to help Site Plan applicants interpret and understand the new bylaw. We also offer to help the Town and schools develop the technical knowledge and data needed to install effective good-neighbor lighting in the future. Finally, during our discussions about the proposed bylaw with Garry Rhodes this past winter, he asked us and we agreed to review new Site Plan applications and advise him of their compliance with the bylaw.

We request that OLAC's term be extended so we can help with these educational tasks and with implementation of the bylaw. OLAC voted formally to pursue this extension request at its 4 May meeting. We propose an extension of three years; at the end of that time, the effectiveness of OLAC's work can be evaluated to decide whether or not to further extend its term.
