





Congratulations on your recent successful course completion with the Massachusetts Hunter Education Program! **Your certificate is provided below; please tear it out carefully and keep this sheet for future reference.** We hope you enjoyed the experience and will enjoy using your new skills and knowledge as a safe, ethical, and responsible outdoors person.

The Trapper Education Course is one of the "advanced" courses offered by the Massachusetts Hunter Education Program which was developed by the Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies and is mandatory for all first-time trappers in order to apply for and obtain a Trap Registration number and trap on the land of another. (All traps used on the land of another must have a valid registration number embedded or cut into the trap.) Trapper Education is also mandatory for all Problem Animal Control Agents. A Massachusetts Trapper Ed certificate may be accepted in other jurisdictions where successful completion of a course is required. Contact those jurisdictions directly to inquire.


What's next? Here is some information to get you started as you pursue this new interest.

How to obtain a Trapping License: In Massachusetts, hunting, trapping and sporting licenses can be purchased electronically, through a new online computer system called [MassFishHunt](http://www.mass.gov/dfwele/dfw/recreation/licensing/vendors/license_vendors.htm). Use this system to purchase a Resident Trapping License (T1), a Resident Trapping (age 65-69) License (T3), or a Resident Sporting (Age 70 or over) license (S3) which includes trapping. Licenses can also be purchased at all MassWildlife offices and participating vendor locations, including some sporting goods stores and other retailers. A complete listing is available online at: http://www.mass.gov/dfwele/dfw/recreation/licensing/vendors/license_vendors.htm.

Licenses that require special provisions, such as a minor's (12-17 years of age) resident trapping license, are only available at vendor locations and cannot be obtained online on your own.

How to obtain a Trap Registration Number:

Trap registration numbers are available from the DFW Boston office at (617) 626-1590. Submit a copy of your certificate along with an application and the \$5.00 trap registration fee. Once obtained, your registration number is yours for life, but must be renewed every two years.

Congratulations on your recent successful course completion with the Massachusetts Hunter Education Program. The Bailey and Hancock training is a component of the standardized Trapper Education Course and qualifies you for a separate certificate. **Your certificate is provided below; please tear it out carefully and keep this sheet for future reference.** As a reminder

- Bailey and Hancock traps may be used, set, tended, or placed only when the trapper has successfully completed a training course and possesses a certificate of course completion. The Bailey and Hancock certificate must be carried when using such traps.
- Bailey and Hancock traps may be used only for taking beaver.
- Bailey/Hancock traps shall not be used except when set in water or when set upon a beaver lodge or beaver dam, snag, stump, rock, or other above-water protrusion entirely or substantially surrounded by water. In addition, whenever and wherever set, the pan of such traps must be completely submerged in water.
- Bailey/Hancock beaver traps can only be used as a live-restraining device.

How to obtain a Trapping License: In Massachusetts, hunting, trapping and sporting licenses can be purchased electronically, through a new online computer system called **MassFishHunt**. Use this system to purchase a Resident Trapping License (T1), a Resident Trapping (age 65-69) License (T3), or a Resident Sporting (Age 70 or over) license (S3) which includes trapping. Licenses can also be purchased at all MassWildlife offices and participating vendor locations, including some sporting goods stores and other retailers. A complete listing is available online at: http://www.mass.gov/dfwele/dfw/recreation/licensing/vendors/license_vendors.htm. Licenses that require special provisions, such as a minor's (12-17 years of age) resident trapping license, are only available at vendor locations and cannot be obtained online on your own.
